Re-Entry Timeline Worksheet

This packet is designed to help you make a re-entry plan. The details below include examples of items to include in your plan and information about resources available. Attached is a worksheet on which you can draft your own plan. As you make your re-entry plan, you will need to account for needs like housing, food, medical care, transportation, and employment, as well as other areas of your life such as relationships, hobbies, and self-care. At the back, you will find more resources that are available by request and contact information for agencies that can help you address some of the needs of your plan.

Sample Re-Entry Timeline

Before Release

- o Arrange for transportation, if not taking RTD
- o Arrange for housing, or make a plan to find temporary housing quickly.
- o Contact family to see if they can offer transportation and/or housing.
- o Apply for food stamps and Medicaid, if needed
- Create a re-entry plan using the timeline and the categories in this packet. Set attainable short-term and long-term goals.
- o If you are taking medication, make sure you have the information needed to get prescriptions refilled.
- Have your parole officer run a check on your record to make sure that you do not have other warrants or holds.

First 72 Hours- The first 72 hours after release are the most critical time for setting yourself up for success. Taking care of what you can before you are released can help you confidently get started on the rest of your plan in these first three days.

- o Go to a community meeting of some sort (NA, AA, Faith-based, Mentoring, etc.)
- O Visit a store to get basic hygiene needs, weather-appropriate clothing, and food staples. The Good Will and Salvation Army have clothing available at low-cost.
- o Look into getting a cheap or prepaid cell phone, if needed.
- o Review your re-entry plan and create a short-term budget.
- o Register as a sex offender, if applicable.
- o Take some time to decompress in a healthy way. If you have been in jail for a while, the transition can be overwhelming.


Week 1

- o Take care of acquiring the identification documents you may need (see section following the timeline).
- o Make a plan for going to the courthouse to address the court costs, fines, and fees you may have accumulated.
- o Look into back Child Support payments if applicable and make a plan to pay them.
- o Begin your job search process.
- Set up a bank account, if possible. Be aware that some places charge check cashing fees, so setting up a basic fee-free checking account can be a way to save money and help you keep your budget in order.

Week 2

- o Continue your job search
- o Purchase an RTD pass if reliable transportation is not already available.

Create a Re-entry Plan



Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs

The pyramid above represents human needs as categorized by psychologist Abraham Maslow. If you look at the diagram, you see that the basic needs such as food and shelter create a base on which security, friendship, self-esteem, and higher-level needs can be built. As you create your re-entry plan, think about meeting your most basic needs first. Once you have prepared for food and shelter, consider how you can establish healthy relationships with friends and family, then how you can spend your time in a way that builds your self-esteem and respect for and from others. Planning to meet your needs can help you succeed in your re-entry goals.

Getting your documents in order

The primary documents you will likely need for finding housing and employment are your birth certificate, social security card, and a state ID card or Driver's License. In order to be employed, you will need to fill out an I-9 form, which requires a U.S. passport or your Social Security card and either a driver's license, state ID, military ID, or school ID. The library can provide you with the applications for a new Social Security card (which is free), your birth certificate, and a state ID. Some of these require a payment and/or an in-person application.

You can get a voucher to help cover the cost of a new ID through Denver Urban Matters on Wednesdays from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. For more information call 303-355-4896.

Setting a Budget

Creating a budget is an important step in your re-entry plan, as it can help you keep track of your financial needs vs. income and keep your spending under control. See the attached worksheet for an example of how to set a budget.

Credit Check

Some places will want to run a credit report before signing a rental agreement or a lease. Having good credit also helps with getting credit cards, auto loans, etc. down the road. You can check on your credit using the Equifax form found in the <u>Community Resource Packet</u>.

The library has books on budgeting and developing healthy credit.

Looking for a Job

Finding a job can seem like a huge challenge, especially with a complicated background and/or gaps in your employment. The good news is there are plenty of places hiring.

The jail library offers a Felon Friendly Employer packet and books on creating resumes and doing well in interviews. You can also search local listings online. Your public library offers job search resources as well. 70MillionJobs.com and hard2hire.com/ex-offenders offer job listings for places that employ ex-offenders.

When you look for a job, consider what strengths and skills you offer. Are you good with people? Are you a natural problem solver? Do you have a great work ethic? How have your life experiences made you stronger or more determined? Focus on the good things you have to offer. Do not lie about your past, but understand that you do not have to offer up information that is not asked for, and your employer does not have the right to run a background check without your permission, although some employers require one as a condition of employment.

Housing

Many people find that they are best off living with family after their release. Be clear with family or friends about the rules of their home, and the rules of your probation or parole. Setting up mutual expectations can help your transition and help maintain healthy relationships while living with someone else.

If family or other free housing is not available, a shelter or low-cost motel may be a stepping stone to more permanent housing once you find employment. You may get a better rate at a motel by paying on a weekly or monthly basis, if the funds are available.

The library has a packet on low-income housing and shelters in the Denver Metro Area.

Parole

If you are on parole, make sure you are clear on what is expected of you. Your parole officer may be able to help you with some of the aspects of your re-entry plan. Keeping up with the requirements of your parole can also help keep you on the right path and out of jail.

Social Life

A good support system can help you readjust. Try to surround yourself with individuals or a community who support you in personal changes that you are trying to make and/or who understand your experiences. This may mean letting go of friendships or relationships that are likely to land you back in trouble. Be clear with those in your life about the changes you are trying to make and the rules of your probation or parole. Doing so enables supportive friends and family to know what is expected of you and also establishes boundaries with friends and family who might not be supportive of changes you want to make. Examples of communities that may be supportive include: re-entry organizations, substance-abuse support groups, faith-based communities, or organizations focused on a common interest (wellness, hobbies, etc.). Libraries, MeetUps, and community centers all offer opportunities to meet other people with common interests.

Idle Time

While you are finding employment, you may have extra time on your hands. Idle time can lead to temptations for you when you're trying to reestablish yourself. Coming up with a plan for how you will spend your free time can help you stay out of trouble. The library offers plenty of free programs, services, and materials you can use to occupy your time. (Send a kite to the library for an application for a library card.) What hobbies, relationships, or self-improvement activities can you fill your time with in a way that will help you reach your other goals?

Self-Care

Re-entry can be a stressful time and taking good care of yourself can help you succeed. Make sure your re-entry plan includes planning for any medical care you need as well as a way to handle stress and your mental health.

In addition to hygiene and productive ways to spend idle time, exercise can help diffuse the reentry stress and fill your time well. There are plenty of low-cost and free local options for exercise and active recreation, including:


